Henny Jurriëns Studio (HJS)

HJS was established in 1995 as a non-profit foundation/stichting in order to provide an open training environment for professional-level dancers. It has since then developed into one of the most important open dance training centers in Europe. The foundations namesake, the late Henny Jurriëns, was one of best known and loved dancers in The Netherlands, noted for his kind and generous character. HJS offers dance training all year round. 2020 marks HJS's 25th anniversary!

1. Content of the program

Two daily classes (ballet and contemporary) are offered Monday through Saturday throughout the whole year. On Saturdays, the contemporary class is a Gaga/dancers class. During holiday periods and when intensive programs are offered, the schedule may vary. There are no membership fees and no reservations required. It is recommended that dancers arrive to the studio at least 15 minutes before class starts.

All ballet classes are accompanied by live music, played by a group of professional pianists. Contemporary classes are accompanied by professional percussionists or with music chosen by the teacher.

Workshops and masterclasses in different genres are offered throughout the year, as well as in seasonal intensive clusters.

a. Schedule

The daily schedule can be found on the <u>website</u>, and at the HJS reception desk. The schedule is subject to change.

b. Instructors



Our teachers represent today's professional dance world. Teachers come from different places from all over the world. They have professional teaching backgrounds, and sometimes are choreographers and directors of companies.

c. Certificate

HJS doesn't provide any diplomas or certificates.

2. Who is it for?

All of the classes and workshops are open to dancers of professional level, ability and training. Classes and workshop will be given in English. If you are a professional dancer and have a physical disability/limitation, you are very welcome too.

a. Registration open classes

No registration is needed. You can come to the studio and register and pay at the HJS reception desk.

b. Registration workshops

Workshops will be posted on the website and social media, and will be included in our e-newsletter. Pre-registration through the website is necessary and entrance to workshops is based on the dancer's CV and dance film and the instructor's requirements. Usually, we select a mix of professional dancers and final-year students. You will receive an answer by email about whether or not you are accepted within five days. Keep checking your spam folder. If you didn't hear from us within five days, please call us in the morning before 12:00, at +31 (0) 412 15 10. If you are selected, we will send you a payment link. Workshops are of different lengths in terms of number of days and amount of hours. In some cases, we offer you the opportunity to take two workshops a day, but usually a class or two plus one workshop is already quite a full program.

3. Costs and payment

a. Open classes

We only offer 5 class cards during the Summer Intensive. You can purchase one at the HJS reception desk: € 40,-.

4. Attendance

Dancers who are available during the full workshop period get priority. If any spots are left, dancers with limited availability are allowed to participate, after approval of the staff (Ineke Drabbe & Gary Feingold).

7. Recordings, filming & taking pictures

Parts of classes and workshops may be recorded by HJS for HJS purposes only. By taking classes and/or workshops at HJS, you consent to these registrations and any use for future HJS marketing purposes. We do not provide any of the participants, teachers or other organizations with the materials, other than those that are published online on our website or social media. Participants will not be allowed to make any video recordings or take pictures of HJS classes and/or HJS workshops.

8. Amsterdam - travel & housing

a. How will I get to Amsterdam?

There are excellent train connections to Amsterdam from France, Germany, Belgium as well as the UK.

If you fly to Schiphol Airport, there's an excellent train connection to various train stations in and around the city, where you can change to trams or buses. Google Maps is the easiest way to plan your route, with more route info on the 9292 website. Information about train tickets can be found on the NS website and about trams and bus tickets on the GVB website or apps.

b. How do I get around?

There are various public transport options near the Chassé Dans Studios. Trams 19 stops nearby at the Admiraal de Ruijterweg, and buses 18 and 247 stop at the Jan Evertsenstraat.

c. Passport & visa requirements

Citizens of most western and many Asian countries can enter The Netherlands without a visa and stay up to 90 days in the entire EU Schengen area. For some countries, visa



requirements apply. Check <u>HERE</u>. In all cases, check the requirements for your nationality online. Please make sure to do your research well in advance of your arrival.

d. Insurance

Please make sure you have an updated travel/health insurance. HJS will not be responsible for any accidents, medical bills or loss of property that occurs during your stay in Amsterdam.

e. Does HJS offer student housing or will you assist in finding housing?

No, you need to arrange your housing yourself. After selection, we will send you some extra information about housing suggestions and getting around in Amsterdam (by bike, public transport).

i. What facilities are around?

The studios are located in a busy part of town. There are cafes, restaurants and supermarkets in the area.
